Croatia Airlines launches Dubrovnik flights



The new route from Prague to **Dubrovnik** will be operated by Croatia Airlines **every Thursday** with an Airbus aircraft for 144 or 174 passengers up to mid-October. The airline will also offer two weekly flights to Split, on Mondays and Saturdays, using the Dash 8-Q400 aircraft with the capacity of 76 passengers. Prague Airport reports operating

Prague Airport reported an operating profit (EBITDA) of CZK 2.2 billion last year. That is a significant increase compared to 2021, when EBITDA was at mere CZK 190 million. In terms of net economic results, the company recorded a profit of CZK 283 million in 2022, which is a significantly better outcome compared to 2021, when the company closed its books with a loss of almost a billion CZK, mainly due to the effects of the Covid-19 pandemic. The 2022 economic results were positively influenced by a noticeable increase in the number of handled passengers, with 10.7 million travelers passing through the gates of Prague Airport last year. A panoramic Swiss train will ride on Czech railways this summer

The unique train carriage with windows partially extending to the ceiling will ride through **destinations** in Moravia from June 11. The train will travel between Graz in Austria and Przemyśl in southeastern Poland. In the Czech Republic, the train will run between Břeclav in South Moravia and Bohumín in Moravia-Silesia. Tickets for the journey are now available



for purchase through the Czech Railway e-shop. A ride between the Czech locations in Břeclav and Bohumín currently runs from CZK 421 in the first-class cabin; according to available information, some of the panoramic cars should also be utilized as second-class cabins. The unique train cars were purchased by Swiss Federal Railways in the early 1990s and ran as first-class cabins throughout locations in Switzerland and neighboring countries on the Gotthard Panorama Express line. Prague will get connection with yet another city in Georgia, **Eurowings started selling tickets** to Tbilisi



The low-cost carrier **Eurowings** plans to fly between Prague and Tbilisi, Georgia and has already started to sell tickets. The flights will start on Oct. 30 with the start of the winter schedule. The carrier will offer two flights a week to Tbilisi, always on Mondays and Fridays. The new route to Tbilisi will be the second connection between Czechia and Georgia, Wizz Air already flies to the second largest Georgian city, Kutaisi. Source: Eurowings

Foreign tourists are returning to Czechia

Almost **3.8 million guests** from all over the world came to mass accommodation facilities in Czechia in the first quarter of this year, 36% more than in 2022. In absolute numbers, Czech tourists prevailed among them, however, there was significant increase in the number of guests from abroad year-on-year. A total of 2,128,217 Czechs stayed in the accommodation facilities, an increase of 12% compared to the same period of last year, while the 1,662,071 foreigners represented an increase of 87%. Germans made a quarter of guests from abroad with 438 thousand arrivals, Slovaks followed at 154 thousand arrivals, guests from Poland ranked third with 133 thousand arrivals. As for the ranking, they were followed by citizens of the United Kingdom and of Italy, with the Italian arrivals recorded a year-to-year increase of 167%. Prague Museum of Meissen porcelain

The Prague Museum of Meissen **porcelain** displays on its two floors over 3,000 pieces of private collection, the largest exhibited collection of Meissen porcelain in **Europe**. Meissen porcelain is the first



European porcelain. The enterprise for its production was founded in 1710, it was one of the most famous manufactories of its kind in Europe, and porcelain is still produced in its premises. Sky Bridge 721 is celebrating the first anniversary since its opening



Sky Bridge 721, the world's longest pedestrian suspension bridge, is celebrating its first anniversary. During just one year from its opening, the 721-meter-long bridge gained worldfamous popularity and was visited by **some 290,000 visitors**. The bridge is suspended more than 95 meters above the ground and offers panoramic views of Mlýnský potok and the vast valley shrouded in clouds. The walkway is 1.2 m wide and the elevation of the bridge is from 1110 to 1116 meters. In 2022, CzechTourism listed the bridge among the 5 most interesting places you can experience in Czechia, and in July 2022 the bridge appeared among the World's Greatest Places for 2022 by the Time magazine and even made it to the magazine's cover. Landscape Festival Jihlava 2023

The venue of the 11th Landscape Festival will be Jihlava, a city often associated with its Zoo or the Prior department store building in the middle



of the square. The Landscape Festival will provide an opportunity for Jihlava to promote other contemporary themes dedicated to the quality of public spaces, their sustainability, biodiversity or adaptation to climate change. It will be an excellent possibility to discover the multilayered nature of Jihlava's urban landscape for both local residents and out-of-town visitors. However, Jihlava is also a place that has a distinct historical cultural footprint. This context is very important for the curatorial concept. which offers a different view of the city's genius loci in collaboration with local organisations (Jihlava Gateway, Vysočina Regional Gallery). The festival is not limited to the city and its immediate surroundings, but by extending to Brtnice, Branišov and Humpolec, it will commemorate important architects, artists and organizations that have shaped and are shaping the cultural image of Vysočina - for example Gustav Mahler, Josef Hoffmann, Adolf Loos, Bohuslav Fuchs, Věra Machoninová, Čestmír and Ivan Kafka or the 8smička cultural zone. The Bevlava cycle route has opened the summer season



The Bevlava international cycle route from Vsetín to Trenčín has opened the summer season of 2023. Bevlava is one of the four long-distance international cycle paths of the Zlín region and will have a total length of **50 kilometers** when completed. It will connect the border regions and also the Bečva, Vlára and Váh river basins - hence the name BeVlaVa. The cycle path winds through the valleys between the hills of Beskydy, Javorníky and the White Carpathians. The middle section of the bike path

is currently still under construction and should be completed in the fall.

From July 14 to Aug. 5, 2023, the 32nd edition of the Festival Krumlov will offer 18 concerts at 12 traditional and unusual concert venues in Český Krumlov and its surroundings. Alfons Mucha: Floral Worlds



This year the Mucha Foundation presents a new series of exhibitions "The Mucha Trail". Under the title Alfons Mucha: Floral Worlds, it focuses on Mucha's iconic works featuring flowers, one of the most characteristic components of Mucha's graphic style, which became synonymous with Art Nouveau in Belle Époque Paris. The exhibitions can be seen in four venues: in Ivančice, Hrušovany nad Jevišovkou and Moravský Krumlov in South Moravia, and now for the first time abroad in **Piešt'any**, Slovakia. These places have special links to the life and art of Alfons Mucha. Tradition 23 - a global online campaign abroad to support tourism in Czechia



In June and July, the first wave of a global foreign online campaign called Tradition 23 will run to support tourism in Czechia, with target countries being Germany, Poland, Slovakia, the United Kingdom, the USA, the Netherlands, France, Italy, Spain, Sweden, Denmark, Austria, Hungary and Israel. The campaign will have 13 themes, each region of the country will be represented by one. The capital city of Prague will have its own creative and will be promoted only in the UK and Benelux. Second wave of the campaign is scheduled for September and October.

Festival of microbreweries at **Prague Castle**



At this year's **Festival of Minibreweries** which will take place on Friday and Saturday June 9-10, 2023 at the Prague Castle, the Czech **Specials** project will also have its stand. The festival is organized annually by the Czech-Moravian Union of Minibreweries, and this year 50 Czech and Moravian breweries and breweries from **Hungary** will participate. The ticket price is CZK 700 and includes a catalog of microbreweries, a tasting glass and unlimited tasting.
