Accor to open a Swissôtel in Mariánské Lázně

The **Accor** hotel group has signed a contract to manage the new five-star **Swissôtel Mariánské Lázně Resort & Spa.** The 130-room hotel, which will be created by merging five buildings, is expected to welcome its first guests in **2024**. Source: Accor

The Czech Inn Hotels chain takes over Hotel International



Once the most luxurious hotel in Czechoslovakia, Prague's Hotel International, is being taken over by the Czech hotel chain Czech Inn Hotels. The chain takes the hotel over from the international Mozart Hotel Group. Hotel International was built between 1952 and 1956 in the style of socialist realism. The building was originally supposed to serve as accommodation for soldiers, but eventually plans were changed and it became a luxury grand hotel. In the 1950s, it was the most luxurious hotel in Czechoslovakia. Currently, the hotel offers a total of 278 rooms, 14 conference rooms with a total capacity of 1,200 people, as well as spaces for private social events. EasyJet to open its twelfth route from Prague

The British airline **easyJet** will open another connection **from Prague**, returning to the route **to Lyon**, France. The line will be in operation from **Sept. 4**, 2023, **twice a week**, on Mondays and Fridays. Source: Prague Airport

Effective **18 July 2023**, **Prague Airport** will have a **direct connection** with the Taiwanese capital of **Taipei**. The direct route from the Taoyuan International Airport to Václav Havel Airport Prague will be operated **twice a week**. **China Airlines** will use the Airbus A350-900s aircraft at the route. Ryanair to offer extensive summer season flight schedule, including flights to Rimini or Skiathos



This summer season, **Ryanair** is offering flights **to four new destinations** from Prague. Ryanair will offer flights to **Gdansk, Rimini, Seville and Skiathos**, and will service its other

Direct flights from Prague to 152 destinations worldwide



Within the **summer flight schedule**, the Vaclav Havel Airport Prague offers direct flights to 152 destinations worldwide including two new long-haul routes to Seoul and Taiwan and nine new connections to popular holiday destinations. On nearly 40 routes, number of frequencies will be increased compared to summer last year. Several new airlines will fly from the Prague Airport this summer, such as Moldova's Air Moldova and FlyOne, China Airlines and Korean Air, Cyprus Airways, the Salam Air of Oman, and Icelandair. Species-rich meadows and restored field boundaries. Prague Airport launches biodiversity support Program

Starting this year, **Prague Airport** systematically **supports biodiversity in**

its vicinity through a new **Biodiversity** program. Within its framework, it will be possible to apply for fundings of projects aimed at strengthening species diversity and ecological stability as well as increasing natural water retention and accelerated regeneration of urbanised landscapes. Prague Airport has allocated CZK two million to fund the program, applicants can receive up to 300 thousand crowns for all their projects combined. Deadline for applications is May 31, 2023. To ensure air traffic safety, the program also defines non-supported areas and measures. These include in particular large bodies of water, planting of trees and introduction of other features attractive to birds in the runway corridors and in the immediate vicinity of the airport. Almost as many people as before the pandemic travel to the Czech Republic from the Baltics, a fair in Vilnius, Lithuania, helped to increase interest

Only 549 fewer **tourists from the Baltics** came to the Czech Republic last year compared to 2019. While in **2022**, **118,877** guests from Estonia, Lithuania and Latvia visited Czechia, before the coronavirus pandemic it was 119,426. The appetite for travel is growing worldwide and the CzechTourism agency presents Czechia using all information and communication tools. As of this summer, all the representative spaces of the Imperial Spa will be open to public, be it the Zander Hall, the richly decorated relaxation salons or the unique imperial bathroom. Open day at Čáslav Airport



After four years, the **Open Day of the** 21st Tactical Air Force Base Čáslav will be held again. This year's Open Day will take place on May 20, 2023. Open cellars



In the spring, many **winemakers open their cellars** and organize tastings of their wines. On **April 22-23**, the **Festival of Open Cellars - Spring in the Mikulov area** will take place, when wine cellars in the municipalities of Mikulov, Březí and Dolní Dunajovice will be open. Around thirty of the region's best winemakers will open their cellars. In the village of **Perná**, winemakers will present their wines on **April 15 and 16**, **Pavlov** will open its wine cellars on **April 29**, and a total of fifteen wine cellars will open in **Horní Věstonice and Dolní Věstonice on June 10**.

Culture

Prague Quadrennial 2023



The fifteenth edition of PQ will take place from June 8 to June 18, 2023. The main exhibitions (Exhibition of Countries and Regions and Student Exhibition) make up the pivotal program of the event and present the most distinctive works of contemporary scenography under the curatorial supervision of the participating countries and regions. The venue will be the Holešovice Market, a former slaughterhouse built at the end of the 19th century, which has served mainly as a marketplace since the 1980s, and recently evolved into one of the strongest cultural centers of the Prague 7 district. The Exhibition of Countries and Regions will be located in the indoor halls, while the Student Exhibition will be for the first time presented in the open sky location of the market square. Apart from the countries and regions of Europe, Asia or North and South America, traditionally participating in the main exhibitions, countries of the Middle East (e.g. Turkey, Lebanon or for the first time ever, the United Arab Emirates) and Africa will present themselves at PQ 2023. Official representations of Russia and Belarus were excluded from the main exhibitions of PQ 2023. The exhibitory program sections will be situated in the **Trade Fair Palace of the National** Gallery Prague. The educational

program will be once again hosted by the **Theatre Faculty of the Academy of Performing Arts** (DAMU). More at <u>https://pq.cz/pq-2023-info/</u>

The Great Little Masters: Aldegrever, Beham, Pencz and Solis



In the first half of the 16th century, graphic art began to flourish especially in the south of Germany with the emergence of a generation of outstanding engravers of the Late Renaissance. Among them was a specific group known as the **Little** Masters, namely Georg Pencz, the **Barthel and Sebald Beham brothers** and Heinrich Aldegrever, as well as Virgil Solis and others. Although differing in style, they had in common the small size of their prints, which tends to be regarded as the main reason for their collective name. Many were followers and students of Albrecht Dürer, and the term Little Masters was also believed to suggest that despite their mastery they did not match his artistic grandeur. The exhibition in the Schwarzenberg Palace presents a selection of engravings and woodcuts from the superb and fairly large collection of graphic art by the Little Masters, housed in the National Gallery's **Collection of Prints and Drawings.** Schwarzenberg Palace, Prague, through July 9, 2023. České Budějovice and Broumov compete for the title of European Capital of Culture 2028

It should be known this summer which Czech city will become the European Capital of Culture in 2028. The city that receives the title will have the chance to present its cultural life and development to Europe throughout the year. The European Union grants the title of European Capital of Culture for one vear to one or more municipalities with the aim of raising international awareness of the award-winning city through culture. Prague became the first Czech city to receive the award in 2000, and five years later Pilsen won the title. For the year 2028, Brno, Broumov, České Budějovice and Liberec were shortlisted. Broumov and České Budějovice became the advancing finalists.

Broumov



As **the smallest candidate in history**, the town of 7,000 succeeded with its **concept of Creative Pilgrimage**, the basis of which is the linking of nature and culture. **Slow cultural tourism** too is one of the basic pillars on which Broumov's candidacy is based. This global trend is based on a sustainable and gentle approach to the landscape and the involvement of local resources so that tourism benefits the local population and does not plunder the nature.

České Budějovice



The candidacy strategy of České Budějovice can be summarized under the term (PERMA)CULTURE. In the original meaning of the word, permaculture is a way of treating nature (water, air, forests), your surroundings (home, school, workplace) and other people in such a way that it is beneficial for everyone in the long term and does not harm anyone. The concept originates from agriculture, but can easily be applied to other fields – such as architecture, education, community, planning, and even art.



In 2028, a total of three cities will receive the title of European Capital of Culture: one in the Czech Republic, the second in France, and the third in an EFTA/EEA country, a candidate country or a potential candidate country for EU membership.

The Kutná Hora Illumination



The Kutná Hora Illumination,

depicting silver mining and processing in Kutná Hora, is a title page (frontispiece) that was cut out of a now unknown choir book. Until 2009, the illumination was only known to an expert audience in the form of a black-and-white reproduction first published in 1929. Despite the fact that the illumination was never exhibited in the years that followed, art historians have always considered it one of the most significant illuminations to have been created north of the Alps. It has always attracted attention, not only because of its large size but also because of its secular theme, which was unusual in late 15thcentury artistic production. The National Team of Chefs and Pastry Chefs won two golds and a silver at the Global Chefs Challenge



In the semi-final European round of the international cooking competition Global Chefs Challenge held in February in Rimini, Italy, the National Team of Chefs and Pastry Chefs of the AKC CR, whose partner again was the Czech Specials project, won three medals. Lukáš Čížek and Adam Tišer won the gold medal in the Global Chefs Challenge category and Anna Marvanová and Magdalena Murínová won the silver medal in the Global Pastry Chefs Challenge category. Hana Budková won a gold medal in the Global Young Chefs Challenge category and advanced to the Global Chefs finals to be hled during the 2024 Worldchefs Congress & Expo in Singapore in October 2024.
